Dietitian vs. Nutritionist

- RD is a legally protected title that can only be used by practitioners approved by ACEND.
- In 26 states, an RD can become a licensed nutritionist (LN), which is also a legally protected title.
 - In these states, including MT, it is illegal to give nutrition counseling without being an RD & LN.
- A nutritionist cannot be a dietitian without the credentials previously mentioned.

Dietitian vs. Nutritionist

Qualifications of a Nutritionist in MT

- Must be currently registered with the Commission on Dietetic Registration (Must be an RD).
- Must have graduated from an accredited college or university in the field of dietetics, food and nutrition, or public health.

What can a nutritionist do?

- Assessing the nutrition needs of individuals and groups and determining resources and constraints in the practice setting.
- Establishing priorities and objectives that meet nutritive needs and are consistent with available resources and constraints.
- Providing nutrition counseling for any individual.
- Developing, implementing, and managing nutrition care systems; and
- Evaluating, adjusting, and maintaining appropriate standards of quality in food and nutrition services.
